Zonta International commits 4 million US Dollars for projects to empower women and girls

Over the next two years, Zonta International will fund three international projects to empower women and girls. Zonta has partnered with UNICEF USA to support UNICEF/UNFPA's new, long-term, strategic, global program to end child marriage. Building upon the successes of the last two years, Zonta will continue its support for the Let Us Learn program in Madagascar in partnership with UNICEF USA. Zonta has also committed its support to a project to empower Syrian refugee and Jordanian women in Jordan with long-time partner, UN Women.


